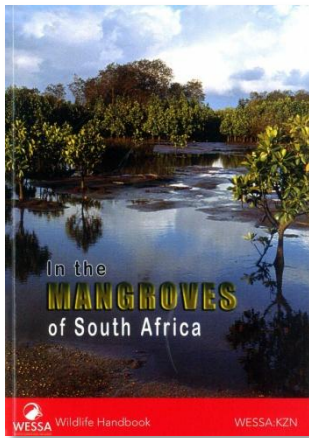

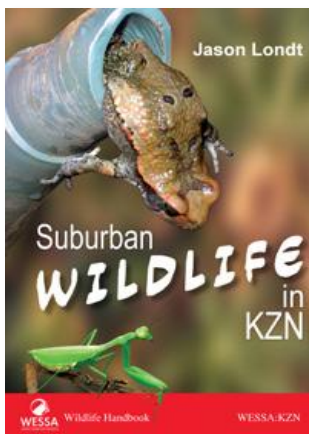

- Lessons to be learned from some overseas practices

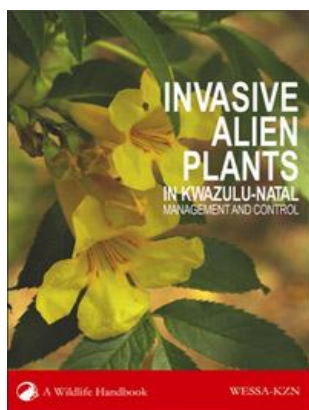

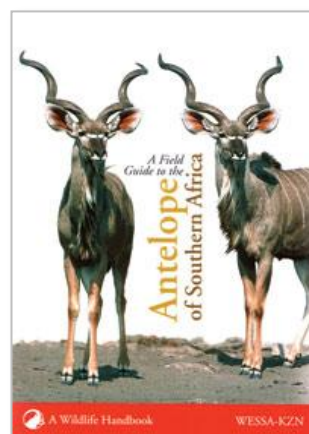
