WESSA's history dates back to 1883 and was only formalised as an association in 1926. This formalisation was necessary for WESSA members to change the future of conservation in South Africa through the proclamation of the Kruger National Park.

WESSA's resilience is rooted in our ability to connect people to their local natural heritage and enabling them to become stewards of their environment.

WESSA's 100-year journey starts before 1926 – with citizens actively and voluntarily taking small actions for their local and national environment.

WESSA's relevance and necessity over 100 years is underpinned by our ability to be present in South African communities, to understand contextual threats and challenges to our biodiversity, and to adapt our strategies to respond to these challenges while staying true to our founding principle: enabling *People to Care for the Earth*.


