• Became an Education Volunteer guide at Durban Botanic Gardens through connecting with Christine.


These early moments introduced me to environmental education and the importance of connecting people with nature.

 Attending the EEASA Conference in 2023 further strengthened my skills and broadened my understanding of environmental education.





- Foundation for growth and purpose in the green space, creating clear career pathways.




WESSA Youth Leadership
